- ★ 2006 Public Education Visioning Institute established
- ★ 2008 Creating a New Vision for Public Education in Texas published
- ★ 2011 Texas High Performance Schools Consortium created by SB 1557
- ★ 2013 HB 2824 gains unanimous support in Texas Legislature
- ★ 2013 TASA launches TASA on iTunes U®
- ★ 2014 THPSC expands to include Consortium Associates
- ★ 2015 HB 18 expands THPSC to 30 districts
- ★ 2016 TASA launches new MISSION: School Transformation website

Texas High Performance Schools Consortium

- ★ 23 school districts empowered by the Texas Legislature via Senate Bill 1557 (2011) to improve student learning in the state
- charged with developing innovative highpriority learning standards and assessment and accountability systems that are not over-reliant on standardized tests and malleable enough to meet the needs of urban, suburban, and rural districts





Consortium Associates

- nearly 100 Texas school districts engaged in transformation work
- ★ invited to join with the THPSC so that more data on the efficacy of transformation initiatives could be collected to inform the Legislature and other stakeholders
- ★ benefit from sharing ideas, resources, and results with Consortium districts and have access to TASA's school transformation services and resources



TASA on iTunes U Expansion

- ★ Project has engaged 280 educators across 75+ Texas districts to curate TEKS-aligned digital resources
- ★ Most recent expansion added literacy, math, science, and social studies resources at the early (K-2) and intermediate (3-5) grade levels
- ★ Original high school core-subject course offerings have been completely updated and refreshed
- ★ Project includes collections for:
 - ★ House Bill 5 College Preparatory Courses
 - ★ Texas-Edition SREB Readiness Courses: Math Ready and Literacy Ready
 - ★ Various CTE and advanced academic courses

- ★ Designed and developed in cooperation with campus and district leaders from across Texas

School Accountability and A-F Ratings

- ★ Texas' A-F ratings scheduled to be implemented in 2017-18
- ★ A-F represents a simplistic approach to rating a complex system
- ★ A-F fails as a meaningful indicator of educational performance
- ★ 17 states have adopted A-F; two states have rescinded their plan
- ★ Oklahoma study: test scores stagnant or declining, with most severe impact on low-income students
- ★ A-F system replace with well-balanced, instructionally-sensitive system that supports high quality instruction and offers opportunity for community input
- ★ Schools accountable to whom and for what!



Performance Assessment Consortium

- ★ Engage future-ready school leaders in collaborative next-gen effort
- ★ Support districts intent on creating a next-gen learning environment
- ★ Develop alternate accountability program to replace present system
- ★ Shift focus away from test-based system based on high and rising test scores
- ★ Create student-based learning culture
